

## Behaviour and Rewards Policy

### Children's Version

#### **At Gedney Church End Primary School, it is expected that you will:**

- Display our school values and follow our class charter.
- Listen to and follow instruction and rules set by adults.
- Show respect to others.
- Use technology safely and responsibly.

#### **Rewards and Recognition**

- Verbal praise by all staff.
- Stickers.
- Track it lights points.
- Values Badges.
- Certificates in assembly.

#### **Unwelcome behaviour**

It is unacceptable for you to:

- Disturb the learning of others.
- Be disrespectful or speak inappropriately.
- Use rude language or swear, including online.
- Use aggressive and physical behaviours towards others.
- Be dishonest.
- Bully others, including online.
- Damage equipment or purposely use it the wrong way.

#### **The Four Stages of Behaviour**

On the other side of this sheet are the 4 stages of behaviour and examples of the consequences for each stage of behaviour.

Behaviour Trackit Lights	Examples	Actions
Green	You feel happy, safe, ready to learn. You demonstrate confidence, aspiration, respect, engagement.	Stickers. “Well done!” “Thank you.” Trackit Lights points. Values badges. Praise notes home (From Mrs Rose) Certificates in assembly
Amber	Not following school values or class charter. You might be: Stopping someone else from learning or playing. Not completing work. Upsetting others with actions or words. Not telling the truth. Not using equipment properly. Rough play.	Your teachers will remind you about our school values and class charter. Your teachers will talk to you about this behaviour. Your teachers will try to help you make the right choice. You will have a chance to show you can make the right choices.
Yellow	Not displaying School values or class Charter. You might be: Showing many amber behaviours. Damaging/stealing school equipment. Being unkind on purpose, including on social media. Stopping others learning. Using rude language, taunting, hurting someone. Refusing to do what is asked.	Time removed from free time, (5 to 15 minutes). You will have to complete missed learning. You will have to repair relationships. You will have to tidy the environment. Your teacher will inform your parents/carers at the end of the day. This might be by phone.
Red	You might be: Showing many yellow behaviours. Bullying, cyberbullying. Using homophobic language. Using racist language. Aggressively swearing at people. Physically hurting others on purpose. Running away. Stealing other people’s property.	Your teacher will inform the headteacher immediately. Your teacher will arrange for your parents/carers to attend a meeting about your behaviour.  Possible consequences – Loss of a fun activity or visit. Loss of position of responsibility if you hold one. Loss of a privilege e.g. representing the school in a competition. Suspension.
After a red stage behaviour, you will be supported to feel calm again. This may take some time. Once you feel calm, we will talk about what happened and help you to stop it from happening again.
